WHEREAS, section 455B.302 of the Code of Iowa requires every city and county of this state to provide for the establishment and operation of a comprehensive solid waste reduction program consistent with the waste management hierarchy under section 455B.301A. and a sanitary disposal project for final disposal of solid waste by its residents: and

WHEREAS, section 455B.306(1) of the Code of Iowa requires that all cities and counties file with the director of the department of natural resources a comprehensive plan detailing the method by which the county will comply with the requirements of section 455B.302 to establish and implement a comprehensive solid waste reduction program for its residents; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive plan ad described in section 455B.306 of the Code of Iowa has

been prepared at the direction of Landfill of North Iowa: as outlined in the Landfill of North Iowa's Comprehensive Plan as approved; and WHEREAS. Hancock County has determined that the adoption and implementation of the proposed comprehensive plan update is in the best interest of the Hancock County with respect to satisfying the County's statutory duties.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HERE-BY RESOLVED BY THE HAN-COCK COUNTY BOARD OF SU-PERVISORS that the Landfill of North Iowa comprehensive plan is hereby adopted as the comprehensive solid waste reduction plan of Hancock County and is committed to the State of Iowa 25 percent and 50 percent waste reduction and re-

cycling goals.

HANCOCK COUNTY **ORDINANCE NO. 31** TITLE: AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE. GARBAGE, REFUSE **RECYCLABLES OR YARD** WASTE AND DESIGNATION OF LANDFILL OF NORTH IOWA

AS DISPOSAL SITE. Be it enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Hancock County:

Section 1 - Purpose The purpose of this ordinance is to designate the Landfill of North Iowa as the sanitary landfill site of Han-

cock County. Section 2. Definitions. For use in this ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows: 1. AGENCY: shall mean the Land-

fill of North Iowa. 2. PERSON: shall mean any individual, firm, association, syndicate, co-partnership, corporation, trust, or other legal entity having proprietary interest in a premise, or oth-

er legal entity having responsibility for an act. 3. GARBAGE: shall mean the solid or semi-solid animal and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooling and serving foods, including cans, bottles and cartons in which it was received and wrappings in which it

may be placed for disposal.
4. RECYCLABLES: All types of newspapers and inserts, paperboard, corrugated cardboard, clear glass food and beverage containers, tin and aluminum cans, and other items as determined by the

5. SOLID WASTE: shall mean unwanted or discarded materials resulting from commercial, industrial, domestic and agricultural operations and normal community activities. Wastes which are solid or semi-solid containing insufficient liquid to be free-flowing are considered to be solid wastes; and include in part the following: garbage, rubhish, ashes and other residue of incineration; street refuse or sweepings; dead animals; solid animal waste: abandoned automobiles: agricultural, commercial and industrial wastes; construction and demolition wastes; and sewage treatment solid residue.

6. YARD WASTES: means all vegetative debris consisting of grass clippings, leaves, brush, trees and wastes from garden residues. Section 3. Agency Designation.

By virtue of a 28E agreement effective July 1, 2022, between the County and the Agency, the sanitary landfill sites now and hereafter operated by the Agency are here-by designated as the public disposal sites for all garbage, recyclables and refuse collected within the corporate limits of the County, not including incorporated city limits.

Section 4. Rules of Agency. The rules and regulations governing the use of the sanitary landfill sites shall be as determined by the Agency to be in the best interests of the general public. The landfill sites shall normally be open to the public on such days and hours as the Agency may designate; however, the Agency may alter the days and hours so scheduled to satisfy unusual conditions or emergencies. The Agency shall be responsible for the operation of the landfill sites in a manner which will assure sanitary and safe conditions at all times. The operation of the landfill sites shall comply with all regulations of all local, State, County or Federal agencies which may have jurisdiction over such operation.

Section 5. Separation of Yard Waste. All yard wastes shall be kept separate from all other garbage, recyclables and refuse. Failure to do so may result in refusal of acceptance by Agency. Section 6. Severability. If any of

the provisions of this ordinance are for any reason illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this ordinance, which are separable from said unlawful provisions, shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions. Section 7. Effective date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its final passage and publications as by law provided.
