The Hancock County, Iowa, Board of Supervisors met in adjourned session on the above captioned date pursuant to adjournment with Supervisors Florence (Sis) Greiman, Gary Rayhons, and Jerry J. Tlach present. Absent: none.

On motion by Supervisor Rayhons, seconded by Supervisor Greiman, and carried unanimously, the Board gave approval to the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION No. 2022-007 RESOLUTION SETTING COURT APPOINTED ATTORNEY FEE SCHEDULE FOR CASES WITHIN HANCOCK COUNTY

WHEREAS, there are several types of court appointments for cases in which Hancock County may be responsible for legal fees of said court appointments; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to set a comprehensive court appointed attorney fee schedule for situations where the County may be held responsible to be consistent with Iowa Code section 815.7.

WHEREAS, Iowa Code section 815.7 sets the reasonable compensation for appointments for a cases not involving felony criminal charges at \$66.00 per hour.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED the reasonable compensation for Court appointed attorneys shall be set to \$66.00 per hour, subject to a maximum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) in cases where the County is responsible for payment. Additional compensation at the rate of \$66.00 per hour may be paid for the court appointment only if the Court has granted a Motion to Exceed the Guidelines prior to submission of the invoice for payment.

On motion by Supervisor Rayhons, seconded by Supervisor Greiman and carried unanimously, the Board gave approval to the following: Approved the quote from Doug's Small Engine Sales & Service, Garner, for a 54 inch TORO zero-turn mower in the amount of \$6,599 and a cover for the mower in the amount of \$79.99. Quarterly reports of the Hancock County Auditor, Recorder and Sheriff for the period ending December 31, 2021.

On motion by Supervisor Greiman, seconded by Supervisor Rayhons and carried unanimously, the Board gave approval to the following: Approved the Work Proposal & Agreement Miscellaneous Small Project Assignments of General Open Ditch Excavation Maintenance Hancock County Drainage Districts for calendar year 2022 from A-1 Excavating and Drainage, Inc, Joice, in the amount of \$2,275.

On motion by Supervisor Rayhons, seconded by Supervisor Greiman, and carried unanimously, the Board recessed at 12:08 p.m. for lunch and resumed at 1:00 p.m. for the remainder of the meeting with Summit Carbon Solutions.

The Board of Supervisor's meeting concluded with a meeting with Summit Carbon Solutions discussing the upcoming carbon pipeline project as it relates to drainage district facilities and road crossings.

No further business to come before the Board, motion made to adjourn at 2:21 p.m. by Supervisor Rayhons and carried. All Supervisors present voting, "Aye," session to adjourn and will meet again on January 11, 2022.
