Time and Place Sealed Proposals Will be Opened and Considered. Sealed proposals will be opened, and bids tabulated at 10:00 A.M. on May 26, 2022, in the Board Room of the Hancock County Board of Supervisors, for consideration by Drainage District Trustees at its meeting at 10:00 A.M. on May 31, 2022. The Drainage District Trustees reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Time for Commencement and Completion of Work. Work on the repair shall commence upon approval of the contract by the Trustees, and as stated in the Notice to Proceed. All work under the Contract must be substantially complete on or before April 15, 2023. Damages in the amount of \$500.00 per day will be assessed for each day the work remains incomplete.

Bid Security. Each bidder shall accompany its bid with bid security, as defined in Section 468.35 of the lowa Code in the amount equal to five percent of the total amount of the bid.

Contract Documents. Copies of the project documents are available for a price of \$25 per set. This fee is refundable, provided the plans and specifications are returned complete and in good usable condition, and they are returned within fourteen (14) calendar days after the award of the project. Preference of Products and La-bor. Preference shall be given to domestic construction materials by the contractor, subcontractors, material, men, and suppliers in performance of the contract and further, by virtue of statutory authority, preference will be given to products and provisions grown and coal produced within the State of Iowa, and to lowa domestic labor, to the extent lawfully required under lowa statutes. Failure to submit a fully completed Bidder Status Form with the bid may result in the bid being deemed nonresponsive and rejected.

Sales Tax Exemption Certificates. The bidder shall not include sales tax in the bid. The County Auditor will distribute tax exemption cer-tificates and authorization letters to the Contractor and all subconwho are tractors identified. The Contractor and subcontractor may make copies of the tax exemption certificates and provide a copy to each supplier providing construc-tion materials. These tax exemption certificates and authorization letters are applicable only for this specific project under the Contract.

Payment for work done will be in accordance with estimates ap-proved monthly by the Engineer proved monthly by the Engineer and in Drainage Warrants issued by the Drainage District, which, if reg-istered and stamped "not paid for want of funds ", shall bear interest at a rate fixed by the Trustees not to exceed the maximum set by law in accordance with Chapter 468 of the Code of Iowa, as amended. The Trustees reserves the right to issue Drainage District Improvement Certificates pursuant to Chapter 468 of the Code of Iowa, as amended, which certificates may be given in exchange for outstanding warrants issued to the Contractor or to the holder thereof. Said warrants to be surrendered, if called by the Trust-ees in exchange for Drainage Disees, in exchange for Drainage Dis-trict Improvement Certificates which shall be taken by the Contractor or holder at par and shall bear interest at a rate fixed by the Trustees not to exceed the maximum set by law in accordance with Chapter 468 of the Code of Iowa, as amended.

Progress payments will be made in an amount equal to ninety per-cent (90%) of the work completed. Final payment will be made not less than thirty (30) days after comple-tion of the work and acceptance by the Board, subject to the conditions and in accordance with the provi-sions of Chapter 468 of the Code of lowa, as amended.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project consists of four separate construction divisions.

Division 1 deals with the Main Tile Repair and consists of construction of approximately 2,417 linear feet of 24" diameter RCP tile and 2,404 diameter RCP tile and 2,404 linear feet of existing tile crushing in place. Connection of both existing private tile and district facilities to the repaired tile line and clearing and grubbing of trees within 40 feel of centerline of the repaired Main Tile.

Division 2 deals with the Later-al 49 Tile Repair and consists of construction of approximately 684 linear feet of 8" diameter HDPE tile, crushing of the old Lateral 49, con-nection of both existing private tile and district facilities to the repaired tile

Division 3 consists of construc-tion of approximately 74 linear feet of 24" diameter steel pipe, jack and bored under County Road B55.

Division 4 consists of construction on approximately 66 linear feel of 8" diameter HDPE tile open cut across Hancock County right-ofway

All divisions thereof also include any and all other miscellaneous items related thereto.

Bidders must bid on all divisions to be considered for award. The Board of Supervisors acting as Trustees can select any combination of divisions which is in the best interest for the drainage district and secondary roads department for award.
