

OFFICIAL COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS: City of Kanawha

Kanawha City Council Proceedings from January 11, 2022

The Kanawha City Council met in regular open session Tuesday, January 11, 2022. All council members were present. The Mayor called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Bassett moved approval of the agenda. The motion was seconded. All were in favor.

At this time, the Mayor opened the Max Levy Hearing. There were no comments and the Clerk stated she had not received any comments outside of the meeting. The Mayor then closed the hearing. Bassett read the following resolution and moved adoption of same:

RESOLUTION

APPROVAL OF FY22-23 MAXIMUM PROPERTY TAX DOLLARS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kanawha has considered the proposed FY22-23 city maximum property tax dollars for the affected levy total, and

WHEREAS, a notice concerning the proposed city maximum property tax dollars was published as required and posted on the city's Facebook page, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing concerning the proposed city maximum property tax dollars was held on 1-11-22,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kanawha that the maximum property tax dollars for the affected tax levies for FY22-23 shall not exceed the following total:

Total Maximum Levy for affected property tax levies - \$282, 421

The maximum property tax dollars requested in the total maximum levy for affected property tax levies for FY22-23 represents an increase greater than 102% from the maximum property tax dollars requested for FY21-22.

The motion was seconded by VanderPloeg. The Mayor called for the vote.
